



2019 Dulux Study Tour Terms & Conditions

1. Entry into the Dulux Study Tour 2019 is open to all architects and graduates of architecture of up to 10 years from graduation of the two-tier or five-year Bachelor of Architecture degree (must have graduated between 2008 - 2017 inclusive). However, it is only open to Australian citizens/residents and New Zealand citizens residing in Australia. It is mandatory that entrants are Australian Institute of Architects members.
2. Non-winning entrants from previous years are welcome to re-enter, subject to meeting the eligibility criteria.
3. Nominees must be nominated by their employer for 'outstanding contribution' to architecture/ architectural practice and/or a main project completed within the last two years. The nominating employer must be a financial Australian Institute of Architects member. Self-nominations are permitted for self-employed nominees, who are financial Australian Institute of Architects members
4. Entry into the 2019 Dulux Study Tour is a two-stage process:

Stage 1

To enter, entrants are required to submit their answers to four nominated questions, their contact details and details of their employer via the online entry system, found at <http://wp.architecture.com.au/duluxstudytourblog/>

Stage 1 submissions must be lodged by no later than AEDT 5pm Friday 26 October 2018. Late submissions will not be accepted. Entrants' answers to the nominated questions will be judged, and shortlisted entrants will be notified to enter into Stage 2. The jury's decision is final. Refer to section 8.

Stage 2

Shortlisted entrants must upload via the online entry system on the blog (as per the above URL), an A4 document that includes: one written employer reference, resume (maximum two pages) and portfolio of works (maximum of four pages). Submissions for Stage 2 close on AEDT 5.00pm Monday 26 November 2018.

Entrants will be judged on the documentation supplied and five winners will be chosen by the nominated jury members.

The jury's decision is final.

Self-nominations must include supporting references from clients or past employers (maximum of three references). The nomination must be uploaded as one PDF document and not exceed 10MB.

5. The Australian Institute of Architects (Institute), Dulux and any additional sponsors reserve the right to publish details of successful applicants (the winners), including their individual winning submissions, in all publications and communications.
6. All submissions will remain the property of the Australian Institute of Architects and will not be returned.
7. The judges' decision is final and the Institute will not provide individual feedback on entries.
8. Five (5) prizes will be awarded for the Study Tour conducted 13 – 22 May 2019. Successful recipients will travel as a group and will need to be available at least two (2) days either side to allow for international travel time. The prize covers domestic transfers, if applicable; return international economy flights, accommodation, transport and an allocation of funds for meals for the duration of the Study Tour program. Each recipient has the opportunity to extend their time at the end of the Study Tour period at their own expense but this must be advised to the Institute at the time of the winners being contacted due to flight arrangements.
9. The five (5) winners will be required to participate in the writing of daily blog whilst on tour.
10. Winners must have a valid passport at the time of travel otherwise they will forfeit their place on the tour.
11. The five (5) successful winners should be available to attend a presentation event in early 2019, where the recipients will be formally acknowledged. This is not mandatory; the announcement will still be made even if they cannot attend. Travel and accommodation costs will be provided by Dulux.
12. The five (5) winners will be required to submit a tour report to the Institute by July 2019 as well as present their report at an EmAGN event in their local state.



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
